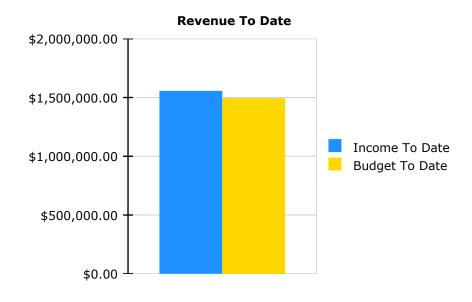

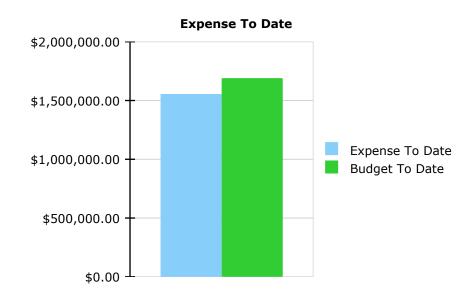

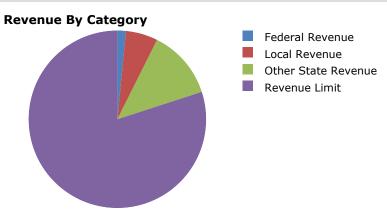

Revenue By Category



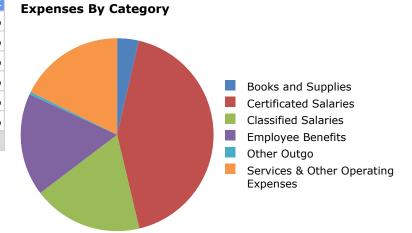

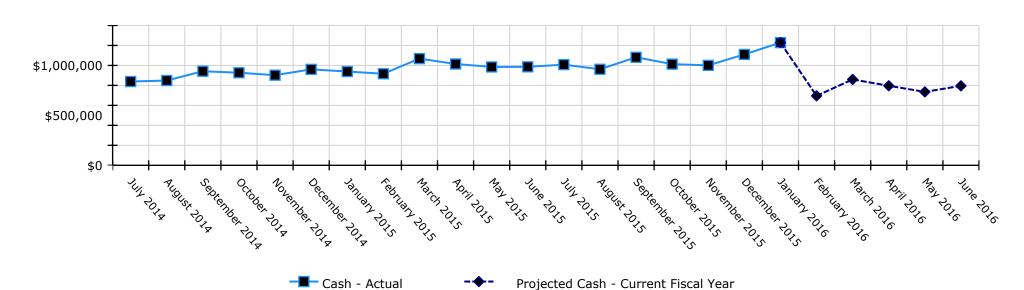
